SIR CEDRIC

No longer seeking the fame and accomplishments that he once did, Cedric's sole focus is on his daughter, Nia, learning the ways of knighthood.

As he regales her with tales from his youth, Cedric gets lost in the stories, sometimes happily and sometimes not.

His daily struggle is to encourage the boldness that he sees in his daughter, while preparing her for the dangers ahead.

He is responsible and steadfast in his caring for Nia, but enjoys having fun just as much as the next fairytale hero.





NIA

Nia, 10, is the daughter of Cedric and his husband, The Prince.

She's impetuous with Cedric's same passion for becoming a knight.

However, instead of hoping to prove her bravery, Nia is more interested in fun adventures. She doesn't take well to sitting still, and likes to hop on her horse, Sky, when a parental speech gets too boring.

Nia cares deeply for her fathers, but doesn't always know how to show it. As an energetic and headstrong Not-Yet-Knight, Nia doesn't care much for the rules, much to her parents' chagrin.



THE PRINCE

The Prince, 33, has many responsibilities, like learning how to rule the kingdom from his father.

Although busy, The Prince finds time to help with Nia's training and the moral lessons that accompany it.

As royalty from birth, The Prince has a different perspective than Cedric on the many adventures they encounter together.

Still, they always agree on fundamentals of right and wrong, and hold Nia, paramount.

Leaving the bulk of her tutelage to Cedric, The Prince is decidedly less strict, and always up for a fun time.





CEDRIC



At 10, Cedric is an ambitious and kind Not-Yet-Knight. His constant desire to prove his courage leads him to look before he leaps, learning lessons the hard way.

Cedric is a born leader and a fierce defender of the underdog, ever since his humble beginnings as a pumpkin farmer.

His ample smarts usually come in the form of resourceful solutions to tricky situations. Although he has a reputation for always doing the right thing, Cedric is not above a playful prank or a snide remark.



GRUNT

A wandering, bridge-less troll, Grunt never listened to anyone, until he met Cedric.

Grunt's knowledge of magical and nonmagical creatures alike makes him a valuable addition to any quest. He exhibits some wild instincts, but as a loyal friend to Cedric, he proves time and time again that he's more than meets the eye.

Tip: The easiest way to get close to Grunt is through flattery. But don't get too close, because he hasn't bathed in years.


